NEW BOOKS

The New Atholl Collection of Fiddle music and dances by Ron Gonnella and Evelyn Murray has been published to commemorate Robert Burns' 1787 Highland Tour. It contains historical details and various anecdotes about the places Burns visited together with a goodly selection of tunes by Ron and appropriately named dances devised by Evelyn. Copies are obtainable, £5.25 including p&p, from Ron Gonnella, 27 Boyd Avenue, Crieff, PH7 3SH.

Nigel Gatherer lives in Edinburgh where he has recently started up a new music publishing venture. He has become interested in Scottish Dance Music and has produced a book containing nearly 100 fine tunes. It is titled "Gatherer's Musical Museum" and the press release says it is "a selection of better more unusual Scottish Dance Music than found in standard collections." While there are indeed many unusual, not so well known, tunes and some never before published we cannot help but notice a number of "standards" including e.g. Gates of Edinburgh, Mason's Apron and The Balkan Hills. I am also not too pleased when I see tunes by Scott Skinner set in the wrong key. Perhaps Nigel ought to be more careful in his research. But for all that the book is without doubt worth obtaining and gives an excellent cross-section of music for anyone new to the art of playing Scottish music. It is, furthermore, excellent value for money at £4.50 in the shops. Society members (please mention The Reel when ordering) can obtain copies at £3.75 inclusive of p&p from Nigel Gatherer, 44 Liberton Drive, Edinburgh EH16 6NN.

P.S. Since writing the above I have had a letter from Chris Duncan, that fine fiddler, from Hunter Valley Branch in Australia. Chris like myself is into "tune research". He has noticed that Ury Water by Scott Skinner the tune for Ross Meor in Book 29 is the same as Bonnie Lossie by Scott Skinner for Sir Murdoch MacDonald's Strathspey in Book 31. They are in different keys and there are very slight variations but quite clearly the same tune. Fascinating, and I haven't got time to contact Muriel Johnstone who arranged tunes for both books before I go to press. Surely someone has noticed it already! I wonder how it all came about? Perhaps it lets Nigel Gatherer off the hook.

RECORD REVIEW

Colin Finlayson and his Scottish Dance Band, RSCDS 9. All the dances in Book 7. Jim MacLeod and his Band. RSCDS 10. All the dances in Book 8.

Bobby Crowe and his Scottish Dance Band. RSCDS 25.

Seton's Ceilidh Band, The Back o' Bennachie, Drumelzier, The Happy Meeting, Fight about the Fireside, Lady Sophia Anne of Bute, Bedrule, The Rothesay Rant, Waltz Country Dance, Macdonald of the Isles. (Available on cassette only; all full length.)

The RSCDS, continuing its policy of three new records per year, gives us good value for money with these ones. In a word, they are all excellent. Good strong playing with lots of body and I am not going to nominate my favourite! In order to get 12 dances on a record those for Books 7 and 8 have a number of dances played only 4 times through, but the Society's Publications and Research Committee have chosen wisely and given us 8 times through some of the more popular dances. e.g. Hamilton House, Red House, Jessie's Hornpipe and Peggy's Love. If I must state a preference for something it is that I much prefer an 8 x 32 reel or jig played as Jim MacLeod does—64 bars per tune (1, 1, 2, 2, 3, 3, 1, 1)—than in 32's (1, 2, 3, 4, 2, 3, 4, 1) which seems to be coming more popular in Scotland.

The Tain Band cassette is also well worth buying. A very fine combination of accordion and fiddle (with no second box) gives a nice melody line. Indeed it is so good that you can perhaps pretend not to hear some not very good drumming. A pity about this because the piano and bass are as competent as the front line. There are some really great tunes on this cassette. Two of my all-time favourite pipe jigs—The Scottish Horse and The Top of Ben Lomond, and Campbeltown Kiltie Ball in Strathspey time.

Another hum dinger of a band record (there are no full length dances) has been produced by Freeland Barbour's Lapwing Records in association with the Argyll Arms Hotel, Bunessan. It features Colin Dewar and his Band in a fine selection of waltzes, marches, jigs and reels with Anda Campbell (accordion) on a couple of tracks and a nice wee fiddle solo from Gordon Simpson. Mention must be made of some fine new tunes getting their first airing on record. I particularly like a 4/4 march by the ubiquitous Robin Brock and a jig by Donald Ridley with a most fascinating name—Strawberries Galore.

Lots more fine tunes can be heard on "The Lilt of Scotland" by Bill Douglas and his Band, (on cassette BBR/C168) and if Gaelic song tunes appeal to your taste listen to no fewer than 49 of them, nicely played in various tempi by John Carmichael and his Band on cassette ZCLBP 2007.

Hear also some Highland fiddle music by five fine players, including Gregor Borland and Christine Martin who master-minded the recording, on Ceol na Fidhle. If you have difficulty in obtaining this one, write direct to Miss Christine Martin, Taigh na Teud, Outram Place, Tain, Ross-shire.

A record from Bobby Harvey and his Band was long over-due. (It is almost unbelievable that it is now twenty years since he recorded his solo fiddle album which must rank high on the list of best Scottish must LP's ever issued). Twenty years on Bobby and his Band who now play regularly at one of Scotland's top hotels have issued an LP called "Gleneagles Favourites" (No.

LOCLP 1042). It includes some real old favourites—Dashing White Sergeant, Duke of Perth, Gay Gordons, etc. Nice stuff and I hope we do not have to wait so long for the next record.

Now what's next! Yes, if you want to hear some fiddle music which departs from the usual March, Strathespeys and Reel format you must get a copy of "Skye dance" played by the one and only Alasdair Fraser with accompaniment by Paul Machlis on piano and synthesizer, and a very passive rhythm section on some tracks.

Time indeed flies; I have been writing these record reviews for sixteen years and I do not think I have every actually said that my favourite instrument is the fiddle, but let me just say that any Alasdair Fraser record is in the same premier league as any by Bobby Harvey.

Finally, we turn to the Gaelic Folk Band "Capercaillie" and their latest record "Crosswinds" and I am lost for words! Just for starters it has one of the finest record sleeves I have ever encountered and an insert with a quite stunning photograph of the Band. For those who as yet have not heard them, they are six in number, with leader Donald Shaw on accordion, Charlie McKerron on fiddle, and a trio who play a variety of instruments from recorder and whistle to guitar and bouzouki. Karen Matheson sings gaelic songs, and to say so is an understatement. Karen is one of the very best singers to come to the front in Scotland during the last decade. Karen does so much more than just "sing". She brings the songs alive in a heart-rendering manner. Bear in mind that many of these songs are beautiful but sad. Yes, I am lost for words. Och, just go and buy the record and you will see what I mean and you will not be disappointed. I just wish I had obtained permission to quote some of the phrases used to describe this record in the July issue of "Folk Roots", but I didn't and it is too late now. I must however add that Karen's singing tracks are interspersed with the "boys" playing jigs, reels et al, sometimes at high speed, but always with great gusto and technical perfection.

CECIL SHARP HOUSE

Dear John,

I am writing to ask if you would kindly bring the matter of Cecil Sharp House to the attention of your readers?

Many of you will be aware of the uncertain future of Cecil Sharp House, which was built by public subscription by the people of England as a memorial to Sharp's work. The English Folk Dance and Song Society did not buy this building, which they hold in trust and use as their head-quarters, unlike the RSCDS who bought 12 Coates Crescent.

For a variety of reasons the National Executive Council of the EFDSS voted to sell Cecil Sharp House, subject to the agreement of the Charity Commissioners. If a speculator is willing to buy without planning permission, he could acquire the site, which is in a valuable residential area, and demolish the building immediately because it is not listed. Even though the building is in a conservation area. Camden Council have stated that they would be unable to prosecute because the building is still unlisted.

The Friends of Cecil Sharp House have worked hard in various capacities during the last year to increase the usage and financial turnover of the property. Recent figures have shown that the House can pay for itself.

The London Branch has had close links with Cecil Sharp House over the years, using it for branch dances, Anglo-Scottish dances and Albert Hall rehearsals. The building has two halls with sprung floors which are a joy to dance on.

If you wish to stop the bulldozers moving in you could help by writing to the Charity Commissioners at 57-60 Haymarket, as well as the Planning Department of Camden Council, who are not in favour of redevelopment, and by supporting the work of the Friends.

This year my wife and I thought it would do us good to take our week's annual holiday trying to improve our Scottish Country Dance technique. Correspondingly we kept our eyes open for suitable venues other than St. Andrews because we have been there before and we live in the south. We applied to the Southern Summer School which is held at Philipps House, Dinton: a lovely village not far from Salisbury, Wilts.

We went on the understanding that the basis of instruction will be that dancing is more enjoyable if done with skill and confidence. We were not disappointed: the instruction was first class and enjoyable hard work—two sessions of a morning, an optional lesson after tea and social dancing after dinner in the evening. Highland Dancing was available but as we are not so spry as once we were we declined those lessons. The 'students' who did participate thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

The added bonus to the holiday was the very friendly atmosphere. The course/holiday was like a house party. We soon got to know everyone else (some members have been going to Dinton for years) and, if you had the energy, badminton, table tennis, putting were on tap, plus beautiful walks. The area is peaceful and full of interest.

In other words, we would recommend the Southern Summer School and are grateful to the people who run it. Keep an eye open for next year's fixture: you may like to try it instead of trekking north!

A VALLEY FULL OF TREE-TOPS

Reel-3 couples-32 bars.

Tune—"Kirk's Hornpipe"—See Middleton's Selection of Starthspeys and Reels arranged by Peter Milne—page 34 (Bayley and Ferguson).

BARS

- 1-4 1st woman and 3rd man, giving right hands, change places and then 1st woman casts up behind 2nd man while 3rd man casts off behind 2nd woman.
- 5-8 1st woman and 3rd man turn with the left hand once round to finish back to back in the middle of the dance facing own partners.
- 9-16 1st and 3rd couples dance a reel of four on the diagonal between first place on the men's side and third place on the women's. They finish the reel in the places from which they began it.
- 17-18 1st and 3rd couples set to partners.
- 19-20 1st man and 3rd woman set again, but 1st woman and 3rd man, with two skip change of step, dance out to their original places pulling right shoulders back.
- 21-24 1st couple with 2nd woman, and 2nd man with 3rd couple dance right hands across and finish in the middle of the dance with both hands joined with partners in promenade hold.
- 25-32 1st, 2nd and 3rd couples promenade. On the last two bars, 1st couple drop hands and cast off to second place, while 2nd couple dance up to top place.

Repeat, having passed a couple.

At the end of their second turn, 1st couple can cast off to fourth place, while 3rd and 4th couple dance up one place each.
