MACLEOD'S MAIDENS

MacLeod's Maidens are rocky pinnacles in the sea, just to the west of Idrigill Point at the south end of the peninsula which contains Macleod's Tables on the extreme west of Skye.

Jig—3 couples—40 bars.

Tune—"Mr. Duncan's Delight" — composed by Robert Mackintosh, see the Ron Gonnella Collection Volume 3 page 9.

RARS

1-4 1st and 2nd couples, joining nearer hands on the sides, set twice.

- 5-8 1st couple, giving right hands, dance down crossing over to second place on opposite sides, and then 1st man dances out and down behind 3rd woman, while 1st woman dances out and up behind 2nd man. Meanwhile, 2nd couple cast up to top place on own sides and then stand.
- 9-16 1st woman dances a reel of three across the dance with 2nd couple beginning by giving left shoulder to 2nd woman. 1st man, similarly, dances a reel of three across the dance with 3rd couple beginning by giving left shoulder to 3rd man. At the end, 1st woman finishes between 2nd couple facing down, while 1st man finishes between 3rd couple facing up. (2nd and 3rd couples dance extra loops at the end of the reels so that they curve in towards 1st woman or man).
- 17-20 All set twice in lines of three facing down and up.
- 21-24 1st couple, giving right hands, change places and then 1st man casts off to second place on the woman's side, while 1st woman casts up to second place on the men's side. Meanwhile, 2nd and 3rd men, and 2nd and 3rd women, turn with the right hand once round moving in towards the centre of the dance to finish in the centre facing out towards own sides closely back to back with partners.
- 25-28 1st man dances three hands round on the women's side with 2nd and 3rd women. At the end, 3rd woman leads the string of dancers down the women's side line so that they finish in the side line. 1st woman, similarly, dances three hands round with 2nd and 3rd men. At the end, 2nd man leads the string up the men's side so that all finish opposite partners in the order 2, 1, 3. (1st couple are on wrong sides.)
- 29-32 2nd, 1st and 3rd couples turn partners once round with the right hand. At the end, 2nd and 3rd couples stay facing out, while 1st couple pull right shoulders back to face in.
- 33-38 1st couple dance reels of three on the sides with their corners beginning by giving right shoulder to second corners.
- 39-40 1st couple, giving right hands, cross over to own sides.

Repeat, having passed a couple.

RECORD REVIEW

Last year Ian Powrie, now resident in Perthshire having returned home from Australia, visited Canada to play his fiddle at the summer school run by the Teachers' Association of Canada. While there he joined forces with the Bobby Frew Four to make a record of full length Scottish country dances. Bobby Frew was for many years the lead accordionist in the popular Stan Hamilton Band.

The dances on the record are: The Edinburgh Castle Reel, Roaring Jelly, John McAlpin, J. B. Milne, The Starry-Eyed Lassie, The Anniversary, The Luckenbooth Brooch, From The Broomielaw, The Australian Ladies.

This is indeed a lovely record. Nice tempo, lots of lift and, although there are two accordionists, the sweet melodic sound of the Powrie fiddle comes over loud and clear.

This record is not generally available in the shops but copies can be obtained from Scottish National Dance Company, 1 Lakeside, Earley, Reading, Berks. RG6 2PG. Tel. 0734 666006 or 62205.

It has come to my notice that some shops in London who stock and sell Scottish records are charging well over the manufacturer's recommended price. Their is no retail price maintenance on records so nothing can be done about it except to shop around. It is in some cases cheaper to order from Scotland and pay the postage. But, beware, I could name some shops North of the Border who also go a bit over the top.

The good news is that one mail order firm in Edinburgh actually charges in most cases, less than the recommended price. If you are a regular purchaser it is worth sending 50p in stamps to Discount Folk Records, 3 Morven Street, Edinburgh, EH4 7LG and getting their catalogue.

Another 50p will bring you a catalogue from Ross Records, 29 Main Street, Turriff, Aberdeenshire.

Dear John,

We should like to assure Mrs. Crawley (whose letter appeared in the last edition of "The Reel") and all Branch members that the price of admission to our dances is kept as low as possible. £2 for a whole evening's dancing to a live band with refreshments included is excellent value and cannot be matched by any other social activity in central London. Occasionally tickets for our dances exceed £2 but usually only when we bring a band down from Scotland or sit down to a full meal.

Mrs. Crawley reminisced about the cost of dancing 25 years ago. In 1962 "The Times" was 5d., minimum basic fare on the London Underground was 6d and admission to our monthly dances was 5/-, which suggests that the cost of Scottish Country Dancing has risen less than most everyday items.

If anyone today finds £2 too expensive for a night's entertainment, then don't forget our season of open air dancing when admission will be absolutely free.

Dear John,

We in Croydon Branch support the general views expressed by Mr. Raper and Mr. Sturrock in the recent issue of The Reel on the need to encourage teenagers to take up Scottish country dancing. However, we must never sacrifice quantity for quality.

We regard it as an important function of our committee to provide balanced programmes for our dances, considering both the less experienced as well as those who regularly attend our classes. We find that the more modern dances, which are taught in our classes, are popular. Indeed, we have not forgotten the year our programmes consisted almost entirely of the older 'down the middle and back' type. Attendances slumped and it took us some years to regain our image.

We are fortunate that we have a successful children's class and have recently been pleased to welcome to our dances three who are now well into their teens. Interestingly, we find that the majority of those taking up Scottish dancing these days are in their thirties; the average age of our basic class is in fact around forty.

The message must surely be—keep our basic classes alive and welcome newcomers, whatever their age and ability. This is the only way to ensure that Scottish country dancing prospers in the future.

EDITOR'S NOTES

I am surprised that no one other than Joyce Martin has commented on John Sturrock's letter. Are London Branch members completely apathetic or, perhaps, completely satisfied with the efforts being made by the hard-working committee? Certainly, we have made some "forward moves" in recent years with e.g. two Saturday afternoon dances for children in our annual calendar; not to mention the huge success of Polesden Lacey. See also the notice headed "NEW NEXT SESSION" in this edition.

Turning to one of John Sturrock's points which Joyce has taken up, we have now re-established the practice of having one Saturday evening dance per year at St. Columba's with a programme of dances suitable for beginners and intermediates. The most recent one, held on 14th March is fresh in my memory. Over 130 people attended-the experienced dancers joining in with the less experienced and a very happy evening it was. Although, it is not common practice to single out Bands (all those who play for the Branch do us proud) it must be stated that much of the success of the dance on 14th March was due to the quite superb music played by Brian Hamilton's Band, who had also earlier in the same day played for the children's dance.

As those who attended the Spring Dance at Porchester Hall are aware, Kenny Thomson had an accident a few days earlier and was unable to travel down with his Band. Thanks to Kenny's brother, Stuart, who in addition to his usual role as second accordionist made all the final arrangements for the evening. Thanks also to Ian Muir from Patna who took over Kenny's role as lead accordionist at very short notice.
