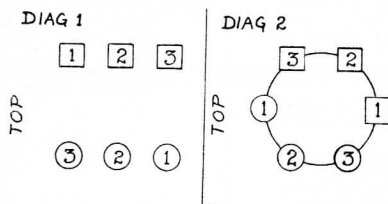

FROM LONG TO SQUARE

In the previous article we considered other shapes as starting positions, such as Glasgow Highlanders. There are others seldom used. The shape also imposes limits on the figures used. Derek Haynes has used in My Heather Hills (Glendaroch Sheet No. 9) a three-couple set in which the dancers are diagonally opposite to their partners, see Diag. 1.



This can also be considered as a three-couple circle as in Diag. 2. Three-couple circular dances when partners are side by side have disadvantages but these are entirely different from those limits set when partners are opposite. To get a continuous progression 1st couple must finish in 3rd place and 2nd couple in leading place. If three-couple sets like this why not four-couple sets with partners diagonally opposed? I haven't tried to use this one yet.

We have in Scottish Dancing a few square dances. The Quadrilles were introduced to Great Britain from Europe and the few we now use are the remnants of a vast number, which for a time, pushed many long set dances out of fashion. Many of these square dances disappeared because they were long sequences, 4 figures of 64 bars would be quite normal, this lengthening being the easiest way of introducing interest. They were difficult to remember or had to be called out by the M.C. With the decline of calling in the ballroom they were soon disappearing and a few more turned into longways sets. The Longwise Eightsome (RSCDS Book 18) was originally a square set. Try it. The figures fit very well, and it should be danced twice, making the lines in the opposite direction the second time.

To use a square set for a shorter and easier to remember sequence means repetition such as in the eightsome reel, but not if a progression round the square is added, or stolen from the longways set. In this each couple moves one place round the set at each repetition. To steal from Glasgow Highlanders, let's keep it anticlockwise. Each couple then dances as head and then as side couple in turn. By doing this a shorter sequence can be used than in the old quadrille (see Stealing The Stone—OSD Book 3).

At the end is a dance—Kyle Strathspey. Somewhere in a dance of this type, head and side couples must do something different to retain interest. In bars 9-16 head couples do a reel of four while sides stand, and on bars 17-24 side couples do rights and lefts while heads stand, and yet it must all be held together as a unified set. Also everyone must have a rest, which is given in this case during bars 9-24. But we will say more about that at a later date.

KYLE STRATHSPEY

Strathspey for four couples in a square set.

Progressive.

The set is numbered clockwise.

Description

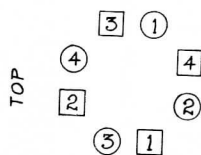
BARS

- 1—2: All ladies dance in and turn to face partner.
- 3—4: All set.
- 5—8: All turn right handed. 2nd and 4th couples return to places, 1st and 3rd couples turn once and finish in line up and down the set.
- 9—16: 1st and 3rd couples reel of 4.
- 17—24: 2nd and 4th couples rights and lefts. (No polite turn at end.)
- 25—28: All set to corners and change places right handed. Face next person.
- 29—32: All set to next person and change places left handed. Now in places as Diag. 1 below. Face person just turned.
- 33—36: Highland Schottische to person now facing.
- 37—40: All men left hands across to opposite side of set. Now with own partner and one place anticlockwise from original place.
- 41—48: All dance 8 hands round and back.

Repeat from new places.

At each turn couples move round the set one place anticlockwise and dance as head or side couples alternately.
