OBITUARY NOTICE

With regret the death of Lady Thomson on 12th January, 1969, is announced.

Lady Thomson was known by few present members of the London Branch and to many even her name will be unknown. She was a member of the Branch Committee in the early years when the Hon. Victoria Bruce was chairman, and subsequently became the second treasurer, a position from which she resigned in 1947. She was Vice-President until 1953 and continued as Hon. Vice-President until 1958 when pressure of other interests no longer allowed her to maintain contact with the R.S.C.D.S.

She was a lady of great personal charm and always helpful to newcomers and the inexperienced dancer. Perhaps her most significant contribution to the history of the Branch was at the start of the war. Classes were being held in a room which became a warden's post and, when it was required for its true work, Lady Thomson arranged for the use of the basement of a restaurant where meetings continued until it was destroyed by bombs. Because dancers were able to meet during this period the Branch had the impetus to remain active during the whole of the war.

THINKING OF DANCES

No. 3 of a series of articles by S. R. Clowes

STANDING STILL AND MOVING FIGURES

Resting time is sometimes neglected when devising a dance. One of my published dances 2d. JIG (OSD Book 3) is a killer in this respect and I use it usually for demonstration purposes. I have seen several comments that new dances are giving more dancing and less standing about and this is welcomed; but devisers must be wary of going too far.

If you look at a popular dance of the traditional type such as Duke of Perth you find that the standing time is quite considerable. Not counting stepping up and down as dancing:—

- 1st couple dances for all 32 bars.
- 2nd and 3rd couples dance for 14 bars each—and—
- 4th couple stand for all 32 bars.

Or take a newer dance—James Cosh's White Heather Jig—

- 1st couple dance for all 40 bars.
- 2nd and 3rd couples dance for 10 bars each—and—
- 4th couple stand for all 40 bars.

There is far more standing than dancing. Both have very good catchy tunes associated with them. Watch how standing couples clap, stamp or lift while waiting to join in. Do we also dance who only stand and wait?

These are two of the most popular dances but most dances give 2nd and 3rd couples far more to do which doesn't matter if you get a rest at top and bottom waiting for your turn. But if all four couples join in the dance sequence the deviser must give a rest to each couple somewhere or he will soon find that they give the dance up as too strenuous and so while top couple in Kyle Strathspey do a reel, sides get their rest and so on. In Jig on the Bridge all four middle dancers dance the first four bars but it was decided that the men needed a rest and this was the place it could best be given. More rest is needed in a Reel or a Jig than in a Strathspey.

When we dance a figure we move inside the figure, for example in grand chain we move round a circle giving hand after hand, but the circle doesn't move if it is danced properly. In a few figures it might be said that we move inside the set boundaries of the figure, e.g., Allemande.

There are a few figures possible that actually move across the floor. I have used one in 'The Spinning Wheel' (OSD Book 3). In this three couples are involved. Two are doing hands across, and one is casting down to join in at each two bar sequence. So the whole figure moves down the set as each couple casts. We move in the figure and the figure itself moves. This is also possible with hands round and casting down, or I have used rights and lefts, leading couple turning down and never up plus casting. This only requires two couples and the leading couple gets the impression of dancing rights and lefts.

Note all these figures are based on casting down. I think one could be evolved by leading down the middle but what would the other couples do? I would be very interested if anyone has any bright ideas.

Here is the dance using moving rights and lefts. It was found very difficult to give a rest to the dancers in devising this dance. Have they got enough?

A MILE DOWN THE ROAD

(4 Couple Longways Set Strathspey)

BARS	DESCRIPTION

Repeat from new places. |
