1-8 1st couple set to one another, then, giving right hands cross to second place on opposite sides. 1st woman dances up behind 2nd man then into the middle and down, while 1st man dances down behind 3rd woman then into the middle and up. 1st couple finish in the middle of the couple finish in the middle of the dance facing the women's side with nearer hands joined. (2nd couple step up on Bars 3-4.)

9-16 1st woman dances a reel of three across the dance with 2nd couple, while 1st man dances a reel of three across the dance with 3rd couple. To begin the reels, 1st woman gives left shoulder to 2nd woman, while 1st man gives right shoulder to 3rd woman.

During the reels, 1st couple, 2nd and 3rd women, and 2nd and 3rd men, join nearer hands very briefly as they dance out through the side

lines.

2nd couple finish in top place facing in, 1st couple in second place on own sides facing out, 3rd couple in third place facing in.

17-24 2nd, 1st and 3rd couples dance reels of three on own sides.

To begin, 2nd couple dance in and down, 1st couple dance out and up, while 3rd couple dance in and up.

All join nearer hands with partners, where possible, in the reels.

At the end:—

2nd couple dance in to join right

hands in top place; 1st couple join right hands as they dance up to second place and retain

hold of hands;

3rd couple dance in to join right hands in third place.

25-28 Retaining hold of partners with the right hand, 2nd, 1st and 3rd couples set twice, but during Bars 27-28 the women turn right about under their partners arms (as in the Gay Gordons).

29-32 2nd, 1st and 3rd couples turn partners with the right hand.

Repeat, having passed a couple. Dance devised by John Drewry and printed with kind permission.

N.B. It is on the programme for Branch Dance on 16th July.
